

NorthWestern Energy Print Services Specialist Nina Nichols has a unique perspective on power outages. Nina grew up in South Africa, where power outages were a daily occurrence.

"Electric reliability in South Africa is very different," she said.

The electric grid in South Africa is frequently overloaded and can't keep up with demand. Up until the last few years, mandatory load shedding was a daily occurrence – power was shut off to a certain area or sometimes a whole city. The outage was supposed to last two hours but frequently went longer.

"Sometimes it was off for days," Nina said. "Almost every house now has generators because we could not rely on our utility to provide us electricity."

Nina has lived in the United States since 1995 but still sees how reliable electricity is taken for granted here.

"We don't realize what we have and what we take for granted," she said.

Nina left South Africa because of rising crime rates. She moved to Italy for a job with the embassy there and then to the United States. She found her way to Montana almost 10 years ago and started with NorthWestern 14 months ago.

As a print services specialist, Nina fulfills the printing needs for the entire company. She prints everything from notepads to Bright magazine to construction books. It's a fast-paced job where two days are never the same.

"Every job is completely different, and that is what I love about my job," Nina said.



Peppermint Crisp Tart

Peppermint Crisp Tart is a beloved South African nobake dessert that's creamy, minty, and irresistibly indulgent. This is an American version of the South African Peppermint Crisp Tart. In South Africa, one would use one packet of Tennis Biscuits and one Peppermint Crisp chocolate.

INGREDIENTS:

1 box of Graham crackers (2 sleeves needed)

20 Andes mint chocolate pieces

4 cups of heavy whipping cream

2 13.4-ounce cans of Nestle Dulce de Leche Caramel treat

DIRECTIONS:

1 Grease a 9"x13" rectangular glass dish and layer the bottom with a single layer of Graham crackers covering all of the dish.

Divide the chocolate into two quantities: 15 pieces and 5 pieces. Finely chop separately. Any food processor works great for this.

3 In a large mixing bowl, whip the cream with an electric mixer until stiff.

4With the mixer running at a low speed, add the caramel in a couple spoons at a time, mixing until combined.

☐ Using a large spoon, fold the chopped 15 Opieces of Andes chocolate into the thick cream

6Spoon half of the filling onto the crust and spread it out evenly. Add another layer of Graham crackers.

7Spoon the rest of the cream mixture evenly over the Graham crackers.

Sprinkle the 5 chopped pieces of Andes chocolate over the filling.

9 Cover the tart with cling wrap and refrigerate for at least 3 hours before serving. Refrigerate any leftovers.




Be Dam Safe near hydro facilities

Waters near hydroelectric dams can be dangerous in numerous ways that may not be obvious. Observe all posted and audible warnings to avoid serious injury or death. Remember:



Stop: Take time to read the safety signs around dams and waterways. Observe all warning signs, fences, buoys, and barriers and keep out of restricted areas.





Listen: Listen for warning sirens that signal when the dam spill gates open. Stay well away from dry riverbeds below dams; they can quickly become rapidly flowing waterways when spill gates open.

Remember, never take your boat past restrictive cables or warning signs. Depending on maintenance schedules and periods of high river flow, boat restraining systems upriver of a dam may not be in place. Never wade or swim alone.

Utility easements

From time to time, you may notice NorthWestern Energy employees or other energy company employees accessing your property. Utility companies are allowed to access private property without first asking for permission.

Utility companies have a legal right to access any of their infrastructure located on customers' property due to easement rights. Easements play a key role in maintaining our electric and natural gas system.

Refusal to grant access to utility personnel can be grounds for termination of service.

If NorthWestern Energy or a contractor needs to access your property, they will be dressed in clothing with the NorthWestern Energy logo and be driving vehicles with the logo. They can also provide a company I.D.
